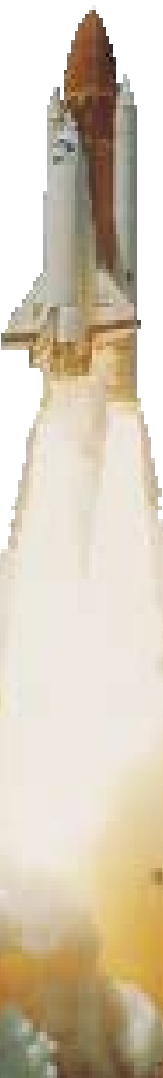


DID YOU KNOW?

⇒ July 20, 2009 will mark the 40th anniversary of the first moonwalk. The crew of Apollo 11 consisted of three astronauts: Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin who landed on the moon and Michael Collins who stayed in the Command Module.

⇒ On Christmas Eve 1968, the Apollo 8 crew of Jim Lovell, Frank Borman and Bill Anders were the first humans to see the far side of the moon with their very own eyes.

⇒ In December 1972, Apollo 17 was the sixth and final lunar landing mission of the Apollo program.



Space Quest 2009

The Challenger Learning Center is currently gearing up for its eighth year of summer camps. Known as Space Quest 2009, this year's summer camps will offer a wide variety of options in length, age level and interest area. We will have our always popular one-day camps for students rising into 2nd-4th grades called Mission Specialist I and II. We will also offer a CSI camp where students try to find the missing Mars



rocks and a Mission to Mars camp in which campers build a life size colony. Robotics Camp will be offered for students entering 5th-8th grades in which campers will build a variety of different robots. Students entering 5th-8th grades can attend Rocket Camp where they will build and launch five different kinds of rockets. **New this year is a 2- hour Astrotot Camp for students entering KDG-1st grades.
